

12 Situation for 22 Jan 2011 Drill

Fire Suppression Situation FS.1

A large branch has fallen here and knocked down power lines. There is some sparking from the lines, which are pinned under the tree. A fire has been ignited by the sparks and is spreading in the dry grass away from the power lines. No hose bib is nearby.

Fire Suppression Situation FS.2

There is a strong smell of gas around this house. No one answers, but the neighbors think that one resident is home. The doors are unlocked, and some windows are open. A wooden structure near the house is on fire, which threatens to spread to the house.

The garage door of this house is open, and a small fire is burning. There are electric sparks and a burning oil pan. The fire threatens to spread to the house and surrounding trees.

Search and Rescue Situation SR.1

A house has partially fallen off the foundation, one wall is leaning. Undefined series of noises can be heard coming from inside, up on the second floor. There is an impression someone might be inside.

A tree fell and blocked the entry door to the house. Someone from inside is calling for help.

Search and Rescue Situation SR.3

A chimney collapsed inside a house. An occupant is trapped under a beam. He is conscious and uninjured but cannot free himself.

Shelter and Logistics Situation SL.1

The earthquake has damaged this structure. Though the elderly residents are safe, the front corner of the house is off the foundation, and there is a danger of collapse.

Shelter and Logistics Situation SL.2

The house has collapsed, with no signs of fire. Two adults and two young children are sitting unharmed on the edge of the rubble without a place to be safely: They need housing by nightfall and are concerned about their family dog which they cannot find.

Shelter and Logistics Situation SL.3

Neighbors from three houses, a total of 8 adults and two kittens, were all forced to leave their homes which are unsafe. They have come to this house for help, but none is available here.

First Aid Situation FA.1

The earthquake has seriously damaged the house and injured two occupants. One occupant has dragged himself outside clear of the debris. He is moaning that his leg is crushed. The other is lying on the ground next to him bleeding with an apparent compound fracture of the forearm.

First Aid Situation FA.2

This house is apparently not badly damaged by the earthquake so the home is safe to enter, but one resident is yelling for help. Her husband is not trapped but apparently a large bookcase fell and knocked him unconscious.

First Aid Situation FA.3

The house is OK, one occupant is out front crying for help. The gas is off and a kitchen fire was extinguished. The fire burned the arm of the other occupant badly who is lying in the kitchen screaming.
